

## **TIN LANTERN**

What you need -	
	Tin Can
	Hammer*
	Nail*
	Work bench

These are more complex using a drill or hammer and nails. The Scouts and older Cubs may like to have a go with help from an adult.

(Please make sure the can is secure when punching holes – maybe use a workbench and clamp it in place or use some clay or playdough to stop it rolling.)

## How to:

• Wash and dry your cans - making sure that all sharp edges are smoothed off.

\* alternatively, a Drill with small drill bit

- Paint or decorate you cans Acrylic paint will last longer if you are putting them outside.
- While your paint is drying you can create a simple template. Draw your shape and then mark where you want to make holes.
- Once your paint is dry you can place your template onto your can.
- Secure your can using a workbench, playdough etc.

You are now ready to make your holes.

**Drill** – Using a small metal drill bit work your way around your template, drilling each hole. (You may want to practice on a spare can.)

**Hammer and Nails** – Using a small nail, work your way around your template making a hole on each mark. (It may help to put a bit off wood inside the can that will help to support it as you drive the nails in.)





## SAFETY FIRST

- Sharp Edges Please make sure all the edges of your can are smooth or wear suitable gloves. As you make holes these will likely leave sharp edges.
- Tools Young People should be appropriately supervised when using power tools or hand tools. Younger members may require help.
